11. CYCLE TOGETHER

A proposal was made to organise a cycle ride open to families, friends, and anyone interested. Discussions will focus on the health and safety aspects, planning a safe route, and considering potential stops at each play park. Further planning will proceed.

12. **GEN A TO Z**

A proposal was made for intergenerational learning, where 2-3 generations integrate and learn together. The idea involves facilitating visits from schools to care homes, where students can read books with the residents. Cllr Beyioku will approach schools to explore how this can be implemented. Additionally, there were suggestions for councillors to engage in more discussions within schools, and to develop outreach programs aimed at educating children.

13. ST ANDREWS SCHOOLS DEBATE COMPETITIONS

It was suggested that we explore the idea of engaging secondary schools in healthy debate competitions, where students argue for and against various topics. This would offer them a different perspective and help them develop important life skills. The proposal will be discussed further at the next meeting.
