2 ELECT A VICE CHAIRMAN RESOLVED

5 FINANCE

The committee agreed this was a good idea and. The Grounds Supervisor updated the committee on pollinator pathways stating that it was waiting to have the final cut, however due to the pandemic Swindon Borough Council currently has no staff to complete.

- (iii) The Grounds Maintenance Supervisor reported that all is going well with grass and hedge cutting especially as this is the first season with a new team. Cllr Tomlinson added that she had received lots of praise and asked for this to be passed on to the team.
- (iv) The Grounds Supervisor updated the committee on estimated costs to install the COVID-19 snake rock. Councillors believed that over £2000.00 was too expensive and not the best way to spend public money.

Members received a report from the Grounds Supervisor regarding purchasing new bins.

The Grounds Supervisor reported that all equipment ordered had now been delivered, however, there was still a wait for new vehicles. He also explained that one of the tippers from SBC needed a new clutch at a cost of £695 and members discussed whether it was worth spending this money.
